MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



After weathering some difficult years during the pandemic, Cascade Connections welcomed some promising changes during 2022. State reimbursements increased in July of 2022, which allowed us to increase our caregiver wages substantially. This boost, combined with the lifting of pandemic-related restrictions, increased staff recruitment and retention and thereby improved our ability to serve our clients.

After a lean year of cutbacks in 2021, our Home Care program was able to add 31 clients in 2022. We were very happy to restore

services to many former clients whose services were paused during the pandemic staffing crisis. Our Group Training Home and Supported Living programs also benefited from many new staff, and Cascade Connections' Training Department accommodated the influx of new hires by adding more trainers and offering more in-person training this year.

Our Supported Living communities in Bellingham and Lynden gained new members and enjoyed many outings during 2022, as community activities continued to reopen. Our Vocational Services program also continued to rebuild, in pace with the gradually recovering economy. A handful of new businesses appeared, and some businesses who had reduced hours or closed during COVID ended up reopening in 2022 and hiring individuals through our agency.

Cascade Connections' programs have positioned themselves to grow further during 2023. We are excited to be recovering the staff resources we need to best serve our community. I want to take the time to thank our community members for your prayers and financial support this past year. God has really been quite good to us, and a lot of lessons have been learned over the past three years!

Please continue to pray for us. We do have two especially important needs right now: to find more community housing for those we serve and to expand our Board of Directors. The Board of Directors represents our community and makes sure that we steward funds appropriately. The Board will provide direction and guide our next 5-year Strategic Plan, which we plan to draft in 2023. 



RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS

As a part of our mission to empower individuals with disabilities to enhance their quality of life, Cascade Connections' residential services include a group training home, a supported living program, and a home care program.

The beginning of 2022 remained extremely difficult for our residential programs due to continued staffing shortages as well as the ongoing challenges of COVID – specifically the Omicron variant and its high transmission rates. We applaud staff and clients alike for their resilience and ability to navigate continuously changing regulations.


Our state reimbursements increased on July 1st of 2022, and we were therefore able to increase our wages. We spent the second half of 2022 on stabilizing and building teams, with an emphasis on manager training. We currently have 206 employees in residential.

CASCADE CHRISTIAN HOME (CCH)

Cascade Christian Home, our group training home, currently supports eight residents in meeting their goals and desires.

The CCH community enjoyed many fun in-home activities over the course of 2022. Staff and residents placed special emphasis on personal goals and growth this year. Although the staffing shortages of prior years continued to persist for much of 2022, CCH staff worked on strengthening our team and everyone agreed on striving for a standard of care that goes above and beyond the expected norms. This constructive communication generated new ideas, excitement to come to work, and all-around cohesiveness.

CCH also underwent some major renovations, including the installation of accessible showers and an overhead lift system. These upgrades make transitions safer for staff and residents alike. CCH is now better prepared for anticipated increases in mobility challenges as residents age.



CASCADE CONNECTIONS SUPPORTED LIVING (CCSL)

Cascade Connections' Supported Living program supports adults with developmental disabilities to live as independently as possible in their own homes and to thrive in their communities.

Thanks to an increase in staff and a decrease in COVID-related restrictions, our Supported Living program had an excellent year of rebuilding and growth. In East Lynden, CCSL extended services to five new individuals, scheduled more community integration activities, increased staff numbers, facilitated two in-person staff meetings, and supported client-led events. The West Lynden team onboarded a new person, hosted a picnic, and scheduled more outings and group activities with individuals we serve.

CCSL Bellingham's community grew as well this year, transferring in two individuals from Lynden and onboarding one new person. CCSL Bellingham facilitated two parties, supported individuals in attending sports games and concerts of their choosing, and coordinated with vocational support programs to help individuals pursue many exciting new work and volunteer opportunities.

CCSL also continued to develop its manager training curricula and activities during 2022.



HOME CARE

Cascade Connections' Home Care program provides personal, respite, and private-pay care to individuals in their own homes.

After suffering through a considerable staffing crisis during 2020 and 2021, the Home Care Department worked hard during 2022 to increase staff and add back many clients whose services had been paused. By the end of 2022, Home Care had 53 clients – an increase of 22 people since 2021!


Home Care has worked hard to build and strengthen its management team. The department plans to continue adding clients and staff during 2023 by creating and implementing some exciting new staff-retention strategies.

VOCATIONAL SERVICES

Vocational Services works with Whatcom County businesses to learn about their needs and support them to find creative solutions that increase diversity and inclusiveness in the workplace. In addition, we support people with disabilities through a discovery process to help them identify their skills, abilities and interests. We then match employers with applicants who may meet their business needs. Through these partnerships, Cascade Connections is able to support the success of each person we support as they seek and sustain employment in our community.

We provide opportunities in two distinct areas: Rehabilitation Services and Commercial Operations contracts. People receiving long-term rehabilitation services worked 36,060 hours and earned a total of \$652,826 during 2022. Our Commercial Operations division employed 41 crew members who worked 23,951 hours and earned \$441,002 this year. Since our inception, Cascade Connections Vocational Services has helped create 1,035 jobs in our community. In 2022 alone, we created 26 new jobs.






TRAINING DEPARTMENT

The Cascade Connections Training Center was founded in 2012. Since that time, our instructors have become some of the best in the state and have trained thousands of students.

During 2022, Cascade Connections Training provided nearly 8,000 training hours of virtual, in-person, blended, and self-study classes to staff and community members. The Training Department also began offering Healthy Relationships training and ASL training to individuals we serve and their support staff.

The Training Department added another trainer this year to help increase our ability to do in-person, hands-on training again as COVID restrictions have lifted. Cascade Connections Training Center has continued contracting with Prometric to offer state Home Care Aide certification testing at Cascade Connections.




FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT


